With your help, Circle of Hope has given more than 72,000 pieces of NEW clothing, PPE, and hygiene essentials to homeless children, women, and men since the COVID-19 crisis struck. You helped us pivot quickly in response to the pandemic and continue providing lifesaving supplies to our most vulnerable neighbors. #### **BPD Officer Thanks Circle of Hope**



Community Service Officer Antonette Cabral sent us a video testimonial about Circle of Hope's partnership with Boston Police Department (BPD) District E-13 in Jamaica Plain. She said:

"Circle of Hope has been the connection, they have been our outlet, they have been our main supporters when it comes to providing for our families...I can't thank Circle of Hope and Barbara Waterhouse enough for what they're doing and the lives that they're changing on a daily basis."

We partnered with BPD in late 2018 and made our first delivery of winter coats and accessories in January 2019. Since then, we have made monthly deliveries of clothing and necessities for families experiencing homelessness in Boston, including families in domestic violence shelters and students in Boston Public Schools. We also respond to emergency requests from BPD officers on behalf of families who lose their homes in house fires. This year, in addition to clothing and everyday toiletries, we are also providing face masks, hand soap, and sanitizer to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 among homeless families. We're proud of this innovative partnership and we're grateful for BPD's help protecting the health of homeless

families we might not otherwise reach.
