Given the success of this trial period, we are extending gently-used donation drop-offs through the month of November! Please see below for our donation guidelines and drop-off scheduling.

Donation Guidelines

In addition to brand new items, we will accept donations of gently used **casual** clothing in excellent condition, including: T-shirts (short and long sleeve), sweatpants, sweatshirts, sweaters, jackets, coats, winter boots, leggings, athletic wear, and jeans. **We can not accept button-down shirts, dresses, business clothing, formalwear, or out-of-season clothing.**

We can accept no more than 3 paper grocery bags or white kitchen trash bags of gently used clothing per drop-off. There is no bag limit for brand new donations.

Appointments are required for donation drop-offs and can be scheduled via Sign Up Genius. To schedule an appointment to drop off **new** donations, **please click here.** To schedule a time to drop off gently used donations, **click here.**
